President Mitch Feldman called the regular meeting to order at 7:31 p.m.

President Mitch Feldman announced and informed the public that a current copy of the Open Meeting Law is posted on the wall of the meeting room and indicated the instructions for those who wish to speak during public forum.

April Gross moved and Katie Slack seconded to approve board minutes from last month's meeting. Motion carried 6-0.

April Gross gave the treasurer report as General Fund Statement beginning balance of \$1,261,281.00, general funds receipts \$19,649.41, and actual cash available in general fund \$1,015,254.54 in the district treasury. Payroll and claims in the amount of \$238,669.49 were presented for payment. Alyssa Reynolds moved, and Marie Sweley seconded the approval of payment of monthly claims. Motion carried 6-0.

Brian Moser gave the principal's report; In-Service and Workshops, Beginning of Year Kickoff and First Days, New Staff, Upcoming events, and Doors/Security/Tech.

Matt Drew gave an AD Report, and action items; Fall Sports numbers, FKC meeting last Wednesday, all coaches are up to date on CPR training & NFHS course, fall sports athletes are taking concussion tests, and upcoming athletic events, Policy review, approval of Substitute Teacher Pay, Building and Grounds, and Budget Presentation.

Cole Lewandowski moved, and Marie Sweley seconded to approve the review of Policies 902.05,903.06,903.07,903.08,903.09,904.01,904.02,905.01,905.02,905.03,905.05,905.06,905.07,905.08,905.09,. Motion carried 6-0.

Cole Lewandowski moved, and Alyssa Reynolds seconded, to approve the Substitute Teacher Pay to \$160. Motion carried 6-0.

Alyssa Reynolds moved, and April Gross seconded to adjourn the meeting at 8:42 p.m. Motion carried 6-0.

Zelle - Pay lunch bills online!

Instead of just cash and checks brought into the office, you can now use your bank's website or app to digitally send payments in any amount, and even schedule for a later date or schedule an autopay (e.g. x amount every month). There is no fee, initial set up is very easy, and sending subsequent payments is even easier.

The only requirement is that your bank offers Zelle payments. Most, including Town & Country Bank, do. And thank you to Town & Country for reaching out and helping us set this up!

- **1. To get started, go to your bank's website or app.** Then find the Zelle section (might also say Bill Pay or Send a Payment).
- **2.** Then add Litchfield as a recipient. Depending on your own phone and bank, you can scan the QR code below, or simply click Add Recipient on your bank's site/app, name the recipient Litchfield and put in lunch@litchfieldps.org for the email address.

3. Decide how much to pay and send. You can refer to the weekly text/email for your kid(s) current amount, or check Powerschool. There is an Add a Memo box where you can include a message for the office, like "add \$x.xx to one kid's account and \$x.xx to the other."

Done! The payment is sent instantly. It will be reflected on Powerschool and the text/email messaging after the office processes it shortly.

[Recommended] Download and log in to the Parent Hub app

- 1. Download **BrightArrow ParentHub** from the Apple App store or Google Play store.
 - The all-in-one messaging where you can also receive and send questions with teachers.
 - Be sure to search the whole app name and find the one with the right logo.
- 2. Click on the Sign Up link at the bottom.
- 3. Select the type of account you will be using by clicking on Parent / Student.
- 4. Enter either an email address or phone number that the school has on file for you.
- 5. Create a password (must be at least 8 characters in length and contain at least one digit).
