Vice President Cole Lewandowski called the regular meeting to order at 7:30 p.m.

Members present: Cole Lewandowski, April Gross, Marie Sweley, Katie Slack, and Alyssa Reynolds.

Visitors: Hillary Rasmussen

Vice President Cole Lewandowski announced and informed the public that a current copy of the Open Meeting Law is posted on the wall of the meeting room and indicated the instructions for those who wish to speak during public forum.

Marie Sweley moved, and Katie Slack seconded to approve excused absent board member Mitch Feldman. Motion carried 5-0.

April Gross moved and Marie Sweley seconded to approve board minutes from the Budget Workshop, Tax Asking, and Regular Board meetings from last month. Motion carried 5-0.

April Gross gave the treasurer report as General Fund Statement beginning balance of \$830,928.86, general funds receipts \$436,158.45, and actual cash available in general fund \$862,472.51 in the district treasury. Payroll and claims in the amount of \$250,283.70 were presented for payment. Alyssa Reynolds moved, and Katie Slack seconded the approval of payment of monthly claims. Motion carried 5-0.

Matt Drew gave an AD Report, and action items; Update School Board Picture when all members are present, NASB State Conference coming up, Policy review, and Buildings and Grounds no updates at this time.

Alyssa Reynolds moved, and Katie Slack seconded to approve the review of Policies; 1005.09 to delete and aprrove 1005.10, 1005.11, 1005.5, 1006.01, 1006.02, and 1007.. Motion carried 5-0.

April Gross moved, and Alyssa Reynolds seconded to accept the resignation of Brian Moser effective immediately. Motion carried 5-

Marie Sweley moved to enter into executive session to discuss personnel matters seconded by April Gross. Motion carried 5-0.

Vice President Cole Lewandowski reinstated the purpose of entering into executive session was to discuss personnel matters.

The Board entered into executive session at 7:57 p.m.

Alyssa Reynolds moved to motion to exit executive session and seconded by Katie Slack. Motion carried 5-0.

The Board exited executive session at 8:23 p.m.

Marie Sweley moved, and April Gross seconded to adjourn the meeting at 8:24 p.m. Motion carried 5-0.
