
competed at Merna on January 24. The team won 3 matches and lost one close match to Broken Bow. What a great way to start the Quiz Bowl season!

Spartans will finish the regular season with games against Arcadia/Loup City and Anselmo-Merna. Subdistrict play begins


on February 12.
