FFA

Litchfield FFA competed in the Career Development Events at Broken Bow on March 21. The chapter had many students competing in team events throughout the day. The Ag Mechanic teams placed first and second in the district. The first place team consisted of: Jacob Heapy, Hunter Sweley, Ashton Behmerwohld, and Walker Skrdla. The second palace team consisted of Lane Slocum, Rowdy LeFever, Wesley Fowler, and Gracie Ritchie. Jacob Heapy placed first as an individual in the Ag Mechanics competition, Hunter Sweley tied for second, and Ashton Behmerwohld placed fourth. Our Agriscience team placed 8th out of 16 teams. President Mitch Feldman announced and informed the public that a current copy of the Open Meetings Law is posted on the wall of the meeting room, and indicated the instructions for those who wish to speak during the public forum.

Marie Sweley made a motion to approve the minutes by fixing one typo from the last meeting as written. Second by Alyssa Reynolds. Motion carried 6-0.

April Gross gave the treasurer report as General Fund Statement beginning balance of \$48,480.05, general funds receipts \$555,915.63, and actual cash available in general fund of \$360,562.90 in the district treasury. Payroll and claims in the amount of \$212,836.10 were presented for payment. Cole Lewandowski made a motion to pay the claims. Second by Jim Holm. Motion carried 6-0.

Brian Moser discussed Access Time Removal with its Pros and Cons, Activities; PT Conference, Elementary Parent lunches, Seniors doing well with State FFA Degree Interviews, and FKC Speech and District FFA.

Matt Drew presented an AD Report Football Schedule for 2024, discussion on possible changes with girls wrestling, hosting boys basketball subs and will have district final, shot clock installation, spring sports begin next Monday, and other action items discussed but will be tabled for vote until the next meeting were the school calendar for the 2025-2026 school year, improvements to the band room.
